

"Note the log risers they are on. These are chunks of dead ash trees from our back yard, killed by Emerald Ash Borer. The larvae of the EAB feed in the cambium layer. The insects never get into the wood itself, but leave tunnels just under the bark." Ron Myhr

"I was gifted some old seed that originated from the seed fund. The seed of this charming plant was labeled as *Glossoloma ichthyostoma*, which has now been changed to *Mandirola ichthyostoma*. I have it growing in a 3" Oyama pot, which is the type of pot I grow all my rhizomatous plants in. I just staked the taller stems up so the flowers aren't orientated correctly for the upright position."

Streptocarpus 'Dale's Gingersnaps' Snaps Back to Life – How to Save a Decapitated Streptocarpus

I have been growing *Streptocarpus* 'Dale's Gingersnaps' for a few years now, with the hope that I could exhibit this large and floriferous hybrid in a show this fall. This past March, to my utter dismay, I suddenly found myself holding the plant in one hand, and the potted root ball in the other, an unfortunate

break which occurred when I was grooming it. My first thought was that given the size of the plant, it would be impossible to recover, as there was not a single root attached to the leaves. However, I have had good results using Clonex®, a rooting gel, for rooting African violet crowns and small streptocarpus crowns, so I thought I would try it for this more challenging situation. First, I removed all the blooms and cut back many of the long leaves, in order to reduce the stress to the plant. I next applied Clonex® to the base of the plant and potted it up in a very small pot using my normal streptocarpus media, a 50/50 mixture of Pro-Mix and perlite. I bagged the plant and



placed it in a cool location with moderate light. As I expected, the plant was severely wilted for a few weeks, but within a couple of months, it had plumped back up and filled the pot with roots. I slowly exposed it to ambient conditions, repotted it into a larger pot, and after a few additional weeks of rest, placed it back on a reservoir. It has been growing well and is just coming back into bloom.

Happily, I was also able to propagate the leaves I had cut, and now I have lots of babies of *Streptocarpus* 'Dale's Gingersnaps' to share.
